BIBLE SOCIETY LIBRARY

On **Wednesday 12 September 2018** around a dozen members and friends of CLIS visited the **Bible Society**'s historic collection of Bibles, now housed at the **University of Cambridge Library.** The group's host for the afternoon was Onesimus Ngunga, the **Bible Society** Librarian.

Highlights of the collection viewed by CLIS members included one of the first printed Gutenberg New Testaments, Martin Luther's German New Testament translation of 1522, and the first printed Chinese New Testament of 1810. THE IMPLANTED WORD

Reading James 1:21 this morning I was struck by the phrase 'the implanted word' (ESV). In verse 18 James reminds us that it was God who made us his people by his word of truth. This phrasing suggests he had in mind both the Bible, which he is primarily talking about as our guide in these verses on living as Christians, but in the background he is also thinking of 'The Word' who has made it possible for this to be true.

To live for God we need to have his word implanted in us to be our guide and compass in this fallen world. We also need the Lord himself dwelling in our hearts as the Implanted Word to empower us to do so. We aren't going to manage otherwise and as James tells us so powerfully in all of his book, theology and right belief is all very well, but all the correct theology in the world will not help us be true Christians. Faith and deeds go together. Faith without deeds is useless and dead, deeds without faith are not what is acceptable to God.

At the heart of this is the implanted word, what better truth for us Christian Librarians to embrace in our daily living for our Lord?
